# Residents continue to have concerns

The Ina Grafton Gage facility may already be bought by the Thunder Creek Rehabilitation Centre but residents of the Pleasant View community aren't necessarily sold on the idea.

During the hour and a half meeting two people walked out. Signals of frustration and concern were mostly audible.

The main issues most residents had about the conversion of Ina Grafton into a social **detox** facility were about safety; both for themselves and for their families.

Paula Shareski has two daughters and her husband travels frequently. She came to the meeting looking for reassurance.

"I live across the street and it's going to be right on my front door," Shareski told the Times-herald. "I'm home alone with daughters and I'm uneasy when he's gone — and that was when it was a seniors' place. Well now that it's a **detox** place I worry about who's here, who's coming to visit, it's a little bit scary."

Shareski said publicly that she found the meeting made her feel less safe.

"I didn't feel like any of the questions were really answered. I don't feel like anybody got any honest answers," Shareski said.

Shareski said that she might be returning on Thursday, hopefully with better results.
